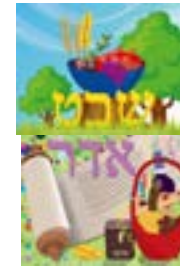

Quick Tip

Teaching Strategies: What's Your Muddiest Point?

Have you ever wondered if your students "got it" after introducing a new topic or skill?

At the end of a lesson that covers new material, ask students to anonymously write down what were the most unclear points in the lesson - what they did not understand thoroughly. This is called "your muddiest point."

Collect the papers and go through them after class. Using the results of your students' muddiest points, modify your next lesson accordingly in order to review and reinforce areas that need strengthening.

This activity is a great way to assess what information and/or skills need reinforcement without judgment or causing embarrassment.
